PREPARATION

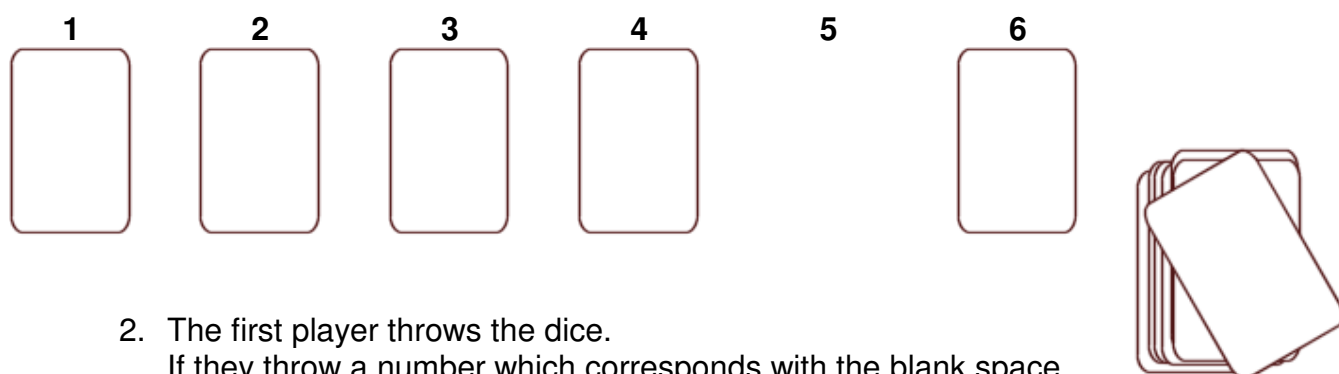
1. Photocopy the previous page and cut out one set of cards for each group of 3 or 4 students.
2. Have a die for each group.



(There is a second set of cards below with different questions in case you want to play the game again or use a larger deck.)

RULES

1. A player shuffles the cards and lays out 5 cards in 6 spaces (they choose one space to leave empty). The players agree on which place to call 1 through to 6 (as the cards may be upside down for some students)! The other cards are put in a pile, face down, on the side.



2. The first player throws the dice.
 - If they throw a number which corresponds with the blank space, they miss a go.
 - If they throw a number which corresponds to a card, another player picks up the card and reads the question aloud.
 - If the first player can answer it, they keep the card. The card is replaced with the top card on the deck. Play moves to the next student.
 - If the first player can't answer it, the card is put back in the deck, and the top card on the deck is put in one of the two spaces. Play moves to the next student.
3. Play moves around the group. The winner is the person with the most cards at the end.
